Fellow Longhorns:

ASB at Leigh is gearing up for our 2020-2021 virtual programming and events, and I could not be more excited! After consulting with site leadership, teachers, and student leaders, we intentionally decided to put out little information during the first two weeks of school. As an organization, ASB carefully considers the needs of our community, both site-based and beyond. Recognizing that the beginning of this school year would pose particular challenges, Leighdership wanted to respect the foundational academic and organizational needs of our teachers and our students. Over the summer, Leighdership students began planning for what a virtual semester might look like. Some of the things we considered centered around how to keep traditional events, like Senior Sunrise, while still following safety guidelines. We also worked with our club presidents to move our 70+ clubs to a virtual format so that students would still be able to be actively engaged in meaningful work that they are passionate about. We revised our yearly initiatives and aligned our programming with those to make sure that our organizational goals aligned with our mission and the overall vision for what community at Leigh would look like.

Towards the middle of summer, we put out a diversity and inclusion survey regarding race, culture, and ethnicity at Leigh. We had over 250 students respond with both quantitative and qualitative input! Working with your Senior Executive Officers, we analyzed the data, and pushed the Leighdersip class to engage in discussions around race, ethnicity, and culture at Leigh. Individual commissions then took their data analysis and discussion-based reflections and looked very specifically at how we as an organization could apply the input from our community towards our events. We aligned our events with our four initiatives for this year: Inclusion and Diversity, Mental Health and Awareness, Anti-Bullying, and Sexual Assault and Harassment Awareness. There were many takeaways which are highlighted more in the attached ASB welcome packet. However, I would like to point out that one common ask from the community was that when we promote awareness-based events, we include more information and resources for students and families. You will notice this effort, as ASB and HeForShe Club collaborate on the first school-wide awareness focus of the year, Woman's Equality Day.

Beginning in September, students will be providing several opportunities a week to engage in online formats. The focus here is on building and sustaining our community. We encourage you to participate, as you will be able to do things like watch your peers teach skills they are passionate about over Instagram, solve weekly student generated riddles, and respond to weekly student generated discussion prompts. You will also see a series of awareness days and weeks planned throughout the semester. Keep an eye out for a survey that will directly ask for your input in how these specific events are planned.

All this information can be accessed by reading over this packet. We strongly encourage you to set aside time this week to sit down with your family and review this packet. It is full of

important information and may answer questions you have. Please bookmark the important websites that will be provided, and add the various social media, Remind, and Google Classroom accounts. We hope that after accessing this information, you will be encouraged to get involved at Leigh. We have a very, very active student body, and a supportive staff. There is likely a club you will want to join. If not, you can always create one! Students are always throwing events and activities. This is one of the things I love the most about Leigh: its vibrant and active student-centered culture.

As always, I am only an email or call away. As your Activities Director, I am here for you. The same goes for any student officer or Leighdership member. Not because it is my job or what they were elected to do, but because we genuinely care about the success of you as an individual, and of our community. Go Longhorns!

We want to highlight the diversity of our student body at LHS, with a focus on information and community building. We want all students to feel valued and respected, and to see parts of themselves in our school image.

Steps we have taken to help build understanding and awareness:

Over the summer, a group of students collaborated to send out an inclusion and diversity survey to the students. The survey focused on issues of racism and bias within our community. 252 students replied, and gave detailed responses regarding their experiences. Recently, with the support of the Activities Director and site Admin, Leighdership engaged in quantitative and qualitative data analysis as they searched for meaningful next steps based on common trends in community feedback. A full recap of the survey data will be posted to our ASB 2020-2021 initiative subpage under Activities.

Potential next steps based on student-led data analysis:

- *Establishment of an information filled cultural awareness and anti-racism center on campus
- *An anonymous way to report observances of racism
- *Ensuring I & D events are more information focused
- *Creating a follow up survey to allow for every student to let ASB know what kinds of topics they would like covered in our awareness and celebration events, and to actively be involved in planning if they want
- *Be more inclusive and work to include as many different groups and identities as possible



We are diverse in many ways. Our goal this year is to recognize as many identities and groups on campus as possible. Much of this work will also be done through our other initiatives and commissions. This data and the follow up steps are just a start. As a community, we look forward to the work ahead!

Factors in our life determine where we lie on the spectrum. Mental disorders, like depression and anxiety, are on one end of the spectrum. We all experience things that affect and influence our mental health, and it is okay to not be okay.

Reducing the stigma surrounding mental health, both in society and on campus, is very important. The mental health of students at Leigh is a top priority and we strive to create an inclusive environment that welcomes and encourages conversations on campus regarding mental health. School should be a safe place where people can open up and expect to be met with understanding and compassion.

What is Bullying?



But really, everyone has been a bully at one point or another in there life. As a Leigh community we want to try help you understand what bullying is and how to help stop it



Statistics

1/3 of kids 12-18 get bullied all around the world. This is a big deal. 1/3 of kids are hurt by people like us and we might not even know it! This is a serious problem.

45% of kids who get bullied tell an adult. This means that 55% of kids have to deal with bullying in their own mind. This can lead to mental heath issues such as depression.

In high school, rumors go around like crazy! It's your job to make sure they do not spread.


SEXUAL ASSAULT AND ABUSE

and one in thirty-three men have been the victim of a rape attempt.



Field Trip Procedures



Pandemic

For the duration of the pandemic, all field trips are cancelled, and no new field trips will be approved. We will notify the community once we are able to authorize field trips. The rest of the information on this page is pertaining to our usual process.

Overnight Trips

Any trip that requires an overnight stay must be approved by the board. You must submit your completed forms to the AD at least 6 weeks prior to the trip, so the board has time to approve them. If you do not, we cannot guarantee trip approval.

Who?

Any clubs, organization, or group on campus who intends to go on a day or overnight field trip, must fill out the required forms, and submit them to the Activities Director. You cannot take any authroized field trip without the forms.

Where are the forms?
